What is the Crabtree Pipeline Project?

The City of Raleigh Public Utilities Department is increasing the capacity of its wastewater collection system in the Crabtree Basin Service Area. These improvements will provide long-term solutions for handling precipitation and preventing sewer overflows.

Raleigh's sanitary sewer system carries wastewater from homes and businesses to a treatment facility where it is treated and cleaned and then released into the Neuse River. With heavy rain, excess storm water can inadvertently enter into and flood the system, causing overflows through manhole covers. These events, known as sanitary sewer overflows, often happen within the existing sanitary sewer system along Crabtree Creek.

The Crabtree Pipeline Project will allow the system to accommodate heavy rain and wastewater flow as Raleigh continues to grow.

How will traffic patterns and greenways be impacted?

If you own property along the Crabtree Pipeline Project, support area businesses, use greenway trails or roadways in the vicinity you will experience impacts from project construction. Impacts include: noise, road closures on Hodges Street, lane closures on Atlantic Avenue, vibrations from blasting for rock excavation, greenway closures and other typical nuances associated with construction projects.

The Crabtree Pipeline will be completed in 2018. Throughout construction, you may see members of the project team surveying the area, as well as large equipment and vehicles transporting construction materials, such as pipe, manholes and stone.

The City will make every effort to minimize construction disturbances near private property, along the greenway trails and roadways located within the improvement area. The City will also provide advanced notice through signage and other communications to notify the public of road and trail closures, as well as changes in traffic patterns.

Where is the project site?

The Crabtree Pipeline Project area encompasses the central part of the City of Raleigh Crabtree Basin Service Area. It is located just southeast of the I-440/US-70 intersection (Glenwood Avenue at Crabtree Valley Mall) and extends to just east of Capital Boulevard.
